In addition to this, upon successful completion of Basic Training, Police Recruits will be permanently appointed as Cadet Constables and receive the applicable service benefits.	

Legal provision for appointment: Section 4 of the Police Act, 1990 (Act No. 19 of 1990) as amended.

Core functions: The incumbents will be responsible for the:

- Maintenance of law and order;
- Preservation of the internal security of Namibia;
- Investigation of any offence of alleged offence;
- Prevention of crime and;
- Protection of life and property.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Be in possession of National Youth Service Certificate (NYS)
- Be in possession of authentic Grade 10 certificate with 24 points in seven subjects and “D” symbol or higher in English or Grade 12 (NSSCO/H) or Grade 11 (New Curriculum) School Certificate with twenty (20) points or higher in six subjects, including “E” Symbol or higher in English.

2. Be between 20 and 40 years old, at the time of the advertisement;
3. Furnish a certified copy of the Identity Document (ID) or a valid passport;
4. Be free from mental or physical defects, disease or infirmity which will probably interfere with training and the proper execution of duties;
5. Undergo and pass comprehensive medical checkup, including physical examination, and pregnancy test;
6. Not have been convicted of **any criminal offence** or have a pending case against their names;
7. Be prepared to undergo interviews, (written and physical fitness test);
8. Be prepared to undergo Police Basic Training, as part of recruitment process;
9. Be prepared to be deployed anywhere within the Republic of Namibia;
10. First priority to be given to applicants with specialization in **TVET**.
